Since 2010, The Bank has reinforced its role of **giving and receiving** traditional materials of heritage value **free of charge**, while also contributing to their study and preservation of knowledge related to traditional construction techniques all over the city.

✓ We provide the patterns for replica and the technical information and support for its correct substitution

The Bank has a small lab, where we clean, make small restorations, study and catalogue all the items collected and prepare them to be ceded









Cataloguing and inventorying:

- ✓ Pattents and all its variations
- ✓ Buildings with ceramic elements
- All the industries that produced the tiles

Allows us to study these elements, to know better this heritage in order to intervene properly in its maintenance
